

## English – Week 11

Monday	Watch two sets of videos analysing Martin Luther King’s ‘I have a Dream’ speech. Read more speeches, answer questions and then practise reading one out loud. (Look up on the internet who Martin Luther King was if you do not know).
Tuesday	Read about Malala and read her speech to the United Nations. (Look up what the United Nations (UN) is if you do not know). Answer questions and write a letter to her.
Wednesday	Listen to a 1960’s song. Annotate the lyrics for persuasive features. (To make someone else do something). Write a different version of the song.
Thursday	Watch the PowerPoint presentation on relative clauses. (We have done these, it is just a reminder). If you access this PowerPoint, you will hear the voice-over teaching. Then read the poem: Old Deuteronomy. You will then practise relative clauses and write sentences about an illustration.
Friday	Read the poem: Old Deuteronomy and compare two performances. You then need to imagine a fourth scene for the poem and write about it using relative clauses.

**Day 1** – Reading a very famous speech and discussing it. Identifying features.

**Day 2** – Reading another famous speech by Malala. Identifying features. Writing a letter to Malala.

**Day 3** – Reading lyrics from a protest song. Identifying features. Writing a new version of ‘Streets of London’.

**Day 4** – Reading the start of a poem from Cats by T.S. Eliot. Practising relative clauses.

**Day 5** – Reading more of the poem from Cats. Comparing performances. Practising relative clauses.
