Pop in to change your book with your parents or complete one last quiz before the weekend.

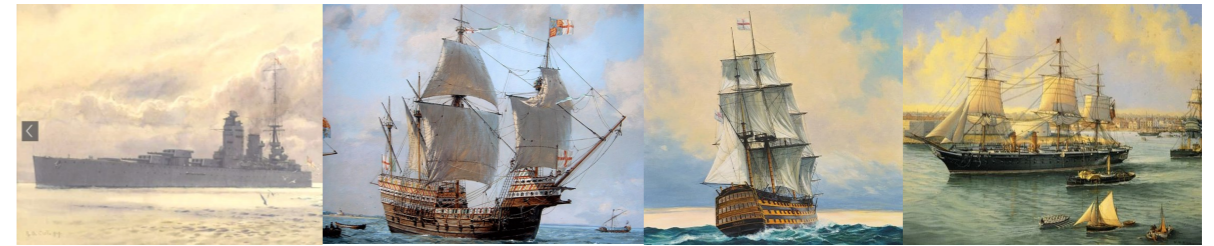
